Plano's District 2 Residents Discuss George Bush Turnpike Ramps & Recreation Center Improvements

Plano City Councilmembers invite District 2 residents to join them for a Neighborhood Roundtable discussion on Thursday, Nov. 1 from 7 to 9 p.m. at the PISD Sockwell Center, 6301 Chapel Hill Boulevard in Plano. Special items to be presented include: updates from the North Texas Tollway Authority on the George Bush Turnpike ramps, the NTTA north extension and S.H. 121; updates from Plano's Parks and Recreation Department on the new Tom Muehlenbeck Center and Carpenter Park Recreation Center expansion; and information on the Community Investment Projects planned for District 2. City Council will also receive public comments and questions on items of interest not posted on the agenda.

Neighborhood Roundtables are part of an ongoing outreach program to present information and answer questions regarding city services and programs. It is a working meeting where citizens help the City explore solutions to district concerns. Though the meeting is focused on District 2, all Plano citizens are welcome to participate. Light refreshments will be served.

Citizens in the District 2 area will receive a special postcard invitation. District 2's north boundary is the City Limit (S.H. 121); the south boundary is the City Limit (President George Bush Turnpike); the east boundary is Coit Road (from the north City Limit to Parker Road) and Ohio Drive (from Parker Road to the southern City Limit); and the west boundary is the City Limit (Midway/Marsh area).

Neighborhood Roundtables are held quarterly and rotated through Plano's four districts to provide an opportunity for citizens and Councilmembers to meet in the convenience of their home neighborhood.
