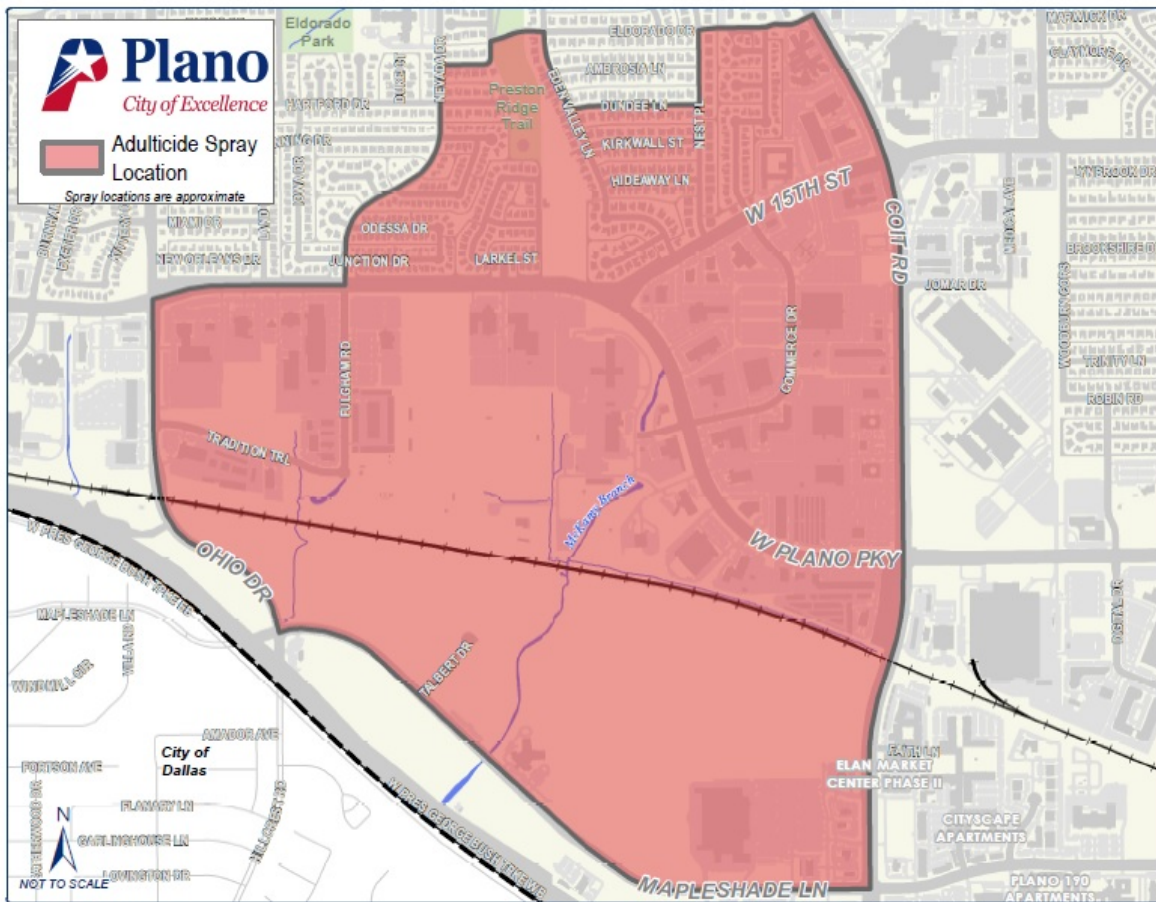

Mosquito Pools Test Positive for West Nile

The City of Plano reports tests conducted of two pools of mosquitoes in City traps have come back positive for the West Nile virus. The City will take proactive measures by spraying targeted locations in and around the areas of the traps. Weather permitting, Plano Environmental Quality Division crews will spray Thursday, October 4 beginning at 9:00 P.M. The targeted spray areas are bordered by the following:

Area 1

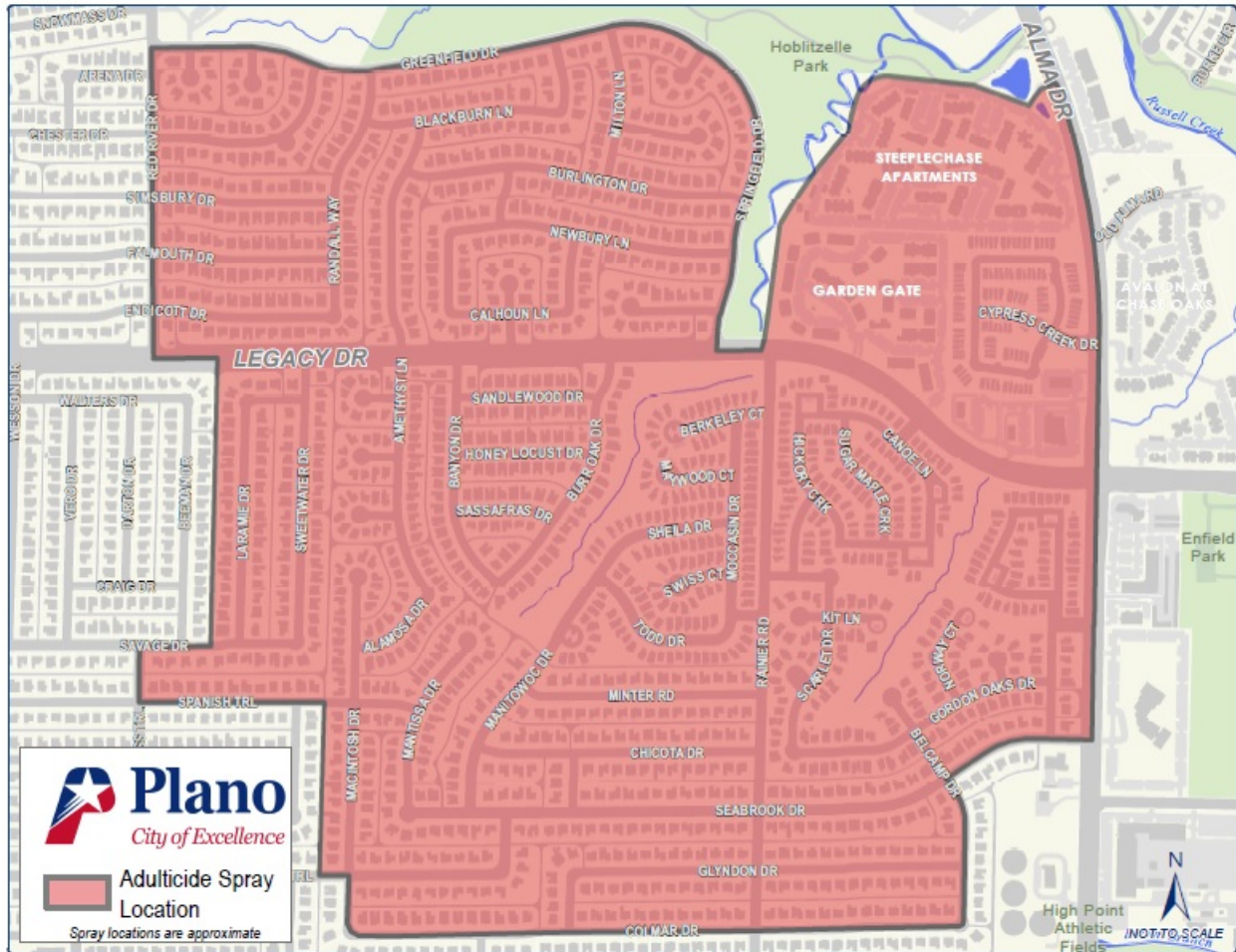
- Eldorado Drive (north)
- Mapleshade Lane (south)
- Ohio Drive (west)
- Coit Road (east)



Area 2

- Greenfield Drive (north)
- Colmar Drive (south)

Red River Drive (west)
Alma Drive (east)



Residents are urged to ensure children and pets are indoors during the time of spraying.

The City encourages citizens to follow common prevention practices:

DRAIN standing water in and around your home and neighborhood.

DRESS appropriately before going outdoors.

DEET (N, N-diethyl-m-toluamide) is an ingredient to look for when purchasing insect repellent. The use of bug spray is recommended at all times, when outdoors, especially during the day.
