Collin County Health Services report 11 new COVID-19 cases, including 4 new cases in Plano. Attached is a spreadsheet for all Collin County cases.

Please note:

- A 62-year-old woman initially reported to us as a McKinney resident on March 26 (Line 88 / Case # 87) is a Dallas County resident. This will adjust McKinney's total, and makes the county total now 128.
- A 41-year-old man from The Colony was originally reported in Collin County and later transferred to another county (Line 52 / Case #51).
- One Plano case is not on the list, as it occurred in the Denton County portion of Plano.
