Collin County Health Care Services (CCHCS) reports 28 new COVID-19 cases in Collin County, including 5 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 406, including 124 in Plano. The County has 235 active cases, including 63 in Plano.

1660 people in Collin County tested negative for the virus.

CCHCS announced a 53-year-old Dallas man died Thursday, the sixth death in Collin County of a person who previously tested positive for COVID-19. The man had an underlying health condition when he tested positive for COVID-19.

522 people are currently under monitoring (PUM) in Collin County, including 142 in Plano. A PUM is an asymptomatic person with an epidemiologic exposure to the COVID-19 virus. The exposure may be close contact with a confirmed case or with their infectious secretions or clinical specimens; or designation as a PUM by CDC.
