Collin County Health Care Services (CCHCS) reports 19 new COVID-19 cases in Collin County, including 4 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 425, including 128 in Plano. The County has 201 active cases, including 63 in Plano.

The number of recoveries (64) now exceeds the number of active cases (63) in Plano. The County numbers also appear to be leveling out with 194 recoveries and 201 active cases.

2367 people have been tested for the virus in Collin County. 1795 tested negative. 425 tested positive. 147 tests are pending.

CCHCS announced a 90-year-old McKinney man died Thursday, the seventh death in Collin County of a person who previously tested positive for COVID-19. The man had an underlying health condition when he tested positive for COVID-19.

575 people are currently under monitoring (PUM) in Collin County, including 146 in Plano. A PUM is an asymptomatic person with an epidemiologic exposure to the COVID-19 virus. The exposure may be close contact with a confirmed case or with their infectious secretions or clinical specimens; or designation as a PUM by CDC.
