Collin County Health Care Services (CCHCS) reports 18 new COVID-19 cases in Collin County, including 4 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 441, including 132 in Plano. The County has 208 active cases, including 56 in Plano.

A positive trend continues. Plano has more recovered cases (75) than active cases (56). As of today, Collin County also has more recovered cases (226) than active cases (208). It's the first time recovered outnumbers active cases since the first case was reported on March 9th.

2394 people have been tested for the virus in Collin County. 1804 tested negative. 441 tested positive. 149 tests are pending.

618 people are currently under monitoring (PUM) in Collin County, including 160 in Plano. A PUM is an asymptomatic person with an epidemiologic exposure to the COVID-19 virus. The exposure may be close contact with a confirmed case or with their infectious secretions or clinical specimens; or designation as a PUM by CDC.
