Collin County Health Care Services (CCHCS) reports 19 new COVID-19 cases in Collin County, including 3 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 472, including 139 in Plano. The County has 203 active cases, including 56 in Plano. CCHCS reported two new deaths, an 88-year-old woman from Wylie and an 82-year-old woman from McKinney, both with underlying health conditions. 10 people have now died from the virus in Collin County.

3039 people have been tested for the virus in Collin County. 2436 tested negative. 472 tested positive. 131 tests are pending.

755 people are currently under monitoring (PUM) in Collin County, including 177 in Plano. A PUM is an asymptomatic person with an epidemiologic exposure to the COVID-19 virus. The exposure may be close contact with a confirmed case or with their infectious secretions or clinical specimens; or designation as a PUM by CDC.
