Collin County Health Care Services (CCHCS) reports 8 new COVID-19 cases in Collin County, including 1 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 477, including 139 in Plano. The County has 190 active cases, including 49 in Plano.

Just as a reminder, duplicate results and case transfer corrections are going to change daily new case counts and total confirmed cases. That said, a woman who was reported positive in Plano Monday was transferred to another County, reducing the Plano total by one. CCHS discovered five duplicate positive test results submitted to them in the past two days, including three duplicates Tuesday and two from Monday.

3182 people have been tested for the virus in Collin County. 2598 tested negative. 477 tested positive. 107 tests are pending.

812 people are currently under monitoring (PUM) in Collin County, including 177 in Plano. A PUM is an asymptomatic person with an epidemiologic exposure to the COVID-19 virus. The exposure may be close contact with a confirmed case or with their infectious secretions or clinical specimens; or designation as a PUM by CDC.
