Collin County Health Care Services (CCHCS) reports 25 new COVID-19 cases in Collin County, including 7 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 494, including 142 in Plano. The County has 200 active cases, including 56 in Plano.

Denton County Health Department reported a third case in the Denton County portion of Plano (75024). The person in this newest case tested positive late into their symptoms and is now recovered. The first two cases recovered as well. The three Denton County cases raise the total of positive cases in Plano to 145.

Two positive cases previously identified by CCHCS as Plano residents are now identified as living in other cities, including a 63-year-old Fairview man and a 70-year-old man from Dallas. That reduced the total number of Plano cases by two. With 8 new cases reported (including the Denton County case), the total number of positive cases in Plano is now 145.

3473 people have been tested for the virus in Collin County. 2872 tested negative. 494 tested positive. 107 tests are pending.

854 people are currently under monitoring (PUM) in Collin County, including 187 in Plano. A PUM is an asymptomatic person with an epidemiologic exposure to the COVID-19 virus. The exposure may be close contact with a confirmed case or with their infectious secretions or clinical specimens; or designation as a PUM by CDC.
