Collin County Health Care Services (CCHCS) reports 11 new COVID-19 cases in Collin County, including 5 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 505, including 146 in Plano. The County has 190 active cases, including 49 in Plano.

One Plano case reported on April 10, a 39-year-old man from 75025, was been transferred to another county.

Plano has an addition three cases in the Denton County portion of the city. All three of those cases are recovered. Those three cases raise the total number of positive cases in Plano to 149.

3511 people have been tested for the virus in Collin County. 2935 tested negative. 505 tested positive. 71 tests are pending.

898 people are currently under monitoring (PUM) in Collin County, including 206 in Plano. A PUM is an asymptomatic person with an epidemiologic exposure to the COVID-19 virus. The exposure may be close contact with a confirmed case or with their infectious secretions or clinical specimens; or designation as a PUM by CDC.
