Collin County Health Care Services (CCHCS) reports 16 new COVID-19 cases in Collin County, including 6 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 521, including 151 in Plano. The County has 190 active cases, including 49 in Plano. CCHCS also reported the 11th COVID-19 related death, a 73-year-old Fairview man with underlying conditions.

One Plano case reported on April 16, a 39-year-old man from 75094, lives in Murphy and not Plano. That reduced the total number of Plano cases by one.

Denton County Health Services reported another positive case in the portion of Plano that is in Denton County. That brings the total number of Plano cases in Denton County to 4. Three have recovered and one is in isolation at home. The new Denton County cases raises Plano's total to 155.

3827 people have been tested for the virus in Collin County. 3250 tested negative. 521 tested positive. 56 tests are pending.

980 people are currently under monitoring (PUM) in Collin County, including 239 in Plano. A PUM is an asymptomatic person with an epidemiologic exposure to the COVID-19 virus. The exposure may be close contact with a confirmed case or with their infectious secretions or clinical specimens; or designation as a PUM by CDC.
