Collin County Health Care Services (CCHCS) reports one new COVID-19 case (McKinney) in Collin County. Plano did not have any new cases. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 522, including 151 in Plano. The County has 187 active cases, including 49 in Plano. CCHCS also reported the 13th COVID-19 related death, a 82-year-old McKinney man with underlying conditions.

There are four cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. Three have recovered and one is in isolation at home. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 155.

3838 people have been tested for the virus in Collin County. 3279 tested negative. 522 tested positive. 37 tests are pending.

980 people are currently under monitoring (PUM) in Collin County, including 239 in Plano. A PUM is an asymptomatic person with an epidemiologic exposure to the COVID-19 virus. The exposure may be close contact with a confirmed case or with their infectious secretions or clinical specimens; or designation as a PUM by CDC.
