Collin County Health Care Services (CCHCS) reports 14 new COVID-19 cases in Collin County, including 4 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 584, including 171 in Plano. The County has 149 active cases, including 33 in Plano.

There are four cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. Three have recovered and one is in isolation at home. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 171.

4909 people have been tested for the virus in Collin County. 4288 tested negative. 584 tested positive. 37 tests are pending.

873 people are currently under monitoring (PUM) in Collin County, including 225 in Plano. A PUM is an asymptomatic person with an epidemiologic exposure to the COVID-19 virus. The exposure may be close contact with a confirmed case or with their infectious secretions or clinical specimens; or designation as a PUM by CDC.
