Collin County Health Care Services (CCHCS) reports 15 new COVID-19 cases in Collin County, including 7 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 654, including 189 in Plano. The County has 177 active cases, including 48 in Plano.

There are four cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. Three have recovered and one is in isolation at home. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 193.

6609 people have been tested for the virus in Collin County. 5916 tested negative. 654 tested positive. 39 tests are pending.

1,021 people are currently under monitoring (PUM) in Collin County, including 266 in Plano. A PUM is an asymptomatic person with an epidemiologic exposure to the COVID-19 virus. The exposure may be close contact with a confirmed case or with their infectious secretions or clinical specimens; or designation as a PUM by CDC.
