Collin County Health Care Services (CCHCS) reports 9 new COVID-19 cases in Collin County, including 3 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 663, including 192 in Plano. The County has 197 active cases, including 57 in Plano.

CCHCS reports the death of a 91-year-old McKinney woman who lived at an assisted living facility. The total number of COVID-19 related deaths in Collin County is now 17.

There are four cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. Three have recovered and one is in isolation at home. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 196.

7052 people have been tested for the virus in Collin County. 6350 tested negative. 663 tested positive. 39 tests are pending.

1,027 people are currently under monitoring (PUM) in Collin County, including 269 in Plano. A PUM is an asymptomatic person with an epidemiologic exposure to the COVID-19 virus. The exposure may be close contact with a confirmed case or with their infectious secretions or clinical specimens; or designation as a PUM by CDC.
