Collin County Health Care Services (CCHCS) reports 13 new COVID-19 cases in Collin County, including 5 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 676, including 195 in Plano. The County has 196 active cases, including 60 in Plano.

Two cases have been transferred out of Plano/Collin County, a 52-year-old male reported on 4/24 (75093) and a 74-year-old female reported on 4/26 (75024).

There are four cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. Three have recovered and one is in isolation at home. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 199.

7568 people have been tested for the virus in Collin County. 6853 tested negative. 676 tested positive. 39 tests are pending.

1,045 people are currently under monitoring (PUM) in Collin County, including 272 in Plano. A PUM is an asymptomatic person with an epidemiologic exposure to the COVID-19 virus. The exposure may be close contact with a confirmed case or with their infectious secretions or clinical specimens; or designation as a PUM by CDC.
