Collin County Health Care Services (CCHCS) reports 14 new COVID-19 cases in Collin County, including 4 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 724, including 212 in Plano. The County has 208 active cases, including 68 in Plano.

CCHCS reported one new COVID-19 related deaths, an 84-year-old McKinney man. His passing is the 21<sup>st</sup> in Collin County.

NOTE: The County transferred a case originally reported as Plano (place of residence) to Dallas. It involves a 64-year-old female (75074). That reduced the numbers in several categories including total cases, age, gender and zip code.

There are four cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. Three have recovered and one is in isolation at home. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 216.

8274 people have been tested for the virus in Collin County. 7517 tested negative. 724 tested positive. 33 tests are pending.

1,160 people are currently under monitoring (PUM) in Collin County, including 316 in Plano. A PUM is an asymptomatic person with an epidemiologic exposure to the COVID-19 virus. The exposure may be close contact with a confirmed case or with their infectious secretions or clinical specimens; or designation as a PUM by CDC.
