Collin County Health Care Services (CCHCS) reports 41 new COVID-19 cases in Collin County, including 8 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 766, including 219 in Plano. The County has 208 active cases, including 67 in Plano.

CCHCS reported one new COVID-19 related deaths, an 88-year-old McKinney man. His passing is the 22st in Collin County.

A case reported in Plano (75075) on 4/21/20 was transferred. It involved a 57-year-old man. That reduced the numbers by one in several categories including total and active cases, age, gender and zip code.

There are four cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. Three have recovered and one is in isolation at home. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 224.

8600 people have been tested for the virus in Collin County. 7802 tested negative. 765 tested positive. 33 tests are pending.

1,211 people are currently under monitoring (PUM) in Collin County, including 323 in Plano. A PUM is an asymptomatic person with an epidemiologic exposure to the COVID-19 virus. The exposure may be close contact with a confirmed case or with their infectious secretions or clinical specimens; or designation as a PUM by CDC.
