Collin County Health Care Services (CCHCS) reports 19 new COVID-19 cases in Collin County, including 5 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 784, including 224 in Plano. The County has 246 active cases, including 71 in Plano.

The gender of one of the new Plano cases is unknown.

Of the 22 deaths in Collin County, 14 occurred at assisted living facilities.

There are four cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. Three have recovered and one is in isolation at home. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 228.

8668 people have been tested for the virus in Collin County. 7851 tested negative. 784 tested positive. 33 tests are pending.

1,229 people are currently under monitoring (PUM) in Collin County, including 329 in Plano. A PUM is an asymptomatic person with an epidemiologic exposure to the COVID-19 virus. The exposure may be close contact with a confirmed case or with their infectious secretions or clinical specimens; or designation as a PUM by CDC.
