Collin County Health Care Services (CCHCS) reports 15 new COVID-19 cases in Collin County, including 5 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 804, including 230 in Plano. The County has 249 active cases, including 72 in Plano.

There are four cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. Three have recovered and one is in isolation at home. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 234.

9,091 people have been tested for the virus in Collin County. 8,253 tested negative. 804 tested positive. 34 tests are pending.

1,268 people are currently under monitoring (PUM) in Collin County, including 339 in Plano. A PUM is an asymptomatic person with an epidemiologic exposure to the COVID-19 virus. The exposure may be close contact with a confirmed case or with their infectious secretions or clinical specimens; or designation as a PUM by CDC.
