Collin County Health Care Services (CCHCS) reports 24 new COVID-19 cases in Collin County, including 8 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 828, including 238 in Plano. The County has 257 active cases, including 77 in Plano.

There are four cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. Three have recovered and one is in isolation at home. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 242.

9,367 people have been tested for the virus in Collin County. 8,505 tested negative. 828 tested positive. 34 tests are pending.

1,305 people are currently under monitoring (PUM) in Collin County, including 348 in Plano. A PUM is an asymptomatic person with an epidemiologic exposure to the COVID-19 virus. The exposure may be close contact with a confirmed case or with their infectious secretions or clinical specimens; or designation as a PUM by CDC.
