Collin County Health Care Services (CCHCS) reports 30 new COVID-19 cases in Collin County, including 9 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 887, including 263 in Plano. The County has 280 active cases, including 84 in Plano.

CCHCS reported three more COVID-19 related deaths, including a 50-year-old Plano man with a serious underlying health condition, a 92-year-old Plano man with underlying health conditions and an 82-year-old McKinney man with underlying health conditions.

This raises the total # of deaths to 27 in the County and 6 in Plano.

The zip code of a case reported on 5/7/20 is still TBD.

There are four cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. Three have recovered and one is in isolation at home. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 267.

10,933 people have been tested for the virus in Collin County. 10,012 tested negative. 887 tested positive. 34 tests are pending.

1,417 people are currently under monitoring (PUM) in Collin County, including 396 in Plano. A PUM is an asymptomatic person with an epidemiologic exposure to the COVID-19 virus. The exposure may be close contact with a confirmed case or with their infectious secretions or clinical specimens; or designation as a PUM by CDC.
