Collin County Health Care Services (CCHCS) reports 14 new COVID-19 cases in Collin County, including 4 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 901, including 266 in Plano. The County has 287 active cases, including 87 in Plano.

A case reported 5/9/20 as a 37-year-old man from Plano (75023) has been changed to a Richardson case in zip code 75082. The numbers in the data box above reflect that change in several categories, including total Plano cases, gender, age and zip code.

The zip code of a case reported on 5/7/20 is still TBD.

There are four cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. Three have recovered and one is in isolation at home. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 270.

11,247 people have been tested for the virus in Collin County. 10,312 tested negative. 901 tested positive. 34 tests are pending.

1,472 people are currently under monitoring (PUM) in Collin County, including 422 in Plano. A PUM is an asymptomatic person with an epidemiologic exposure to the COVID-19 virus. The exposure may be

close contact with a confirmed case or with their infectious secretions or clinical specimens; or designation as a PUM by CDC.
