Collin County Health Care Services (CCHCS) reports 17 new COVID-19 cases in Collin County, including 2 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 918, including 268 in Plano. The County has 303 active cases, including 87 in Plano.

CCHCS reports the death of a 90-year-old woman from McKinney with Underlying health conditions. She died at a memory care facility. It raises the total of COVID-19 related deaths in Collin County to 28.

The zip code of a case reported on 5/7/20 that was classified as TBD, came from the 75074 zip code. The numbers above reflect the added case to that zip code.

There are four cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. Three have recovered and one is in isolation at home. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 272.

11,629 people have been tested for the virus in Collin County. 10,677 tested negative. 918 tested positive. 34 tests are pending.

1,482 people are currently under monitoring (PUM) in Collin County, including 422 in Plano. A PUM is an asymptomatic person with an epidemiologic exposure to the COVID-19 virus. The exposure may be

close contact with a confirmed case or with their infectious secretions or clinical specimens; or designation as a PUM by CDC.
