Collin County Health Care Services (CCHCS) reports 21 new COVID-19 cases in Collin County, including 10 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 939, including 278 in Plano. The County has 303 active cases, including 87 in Plano.

CCHCS reports the death of a 77-year-old Plano woman with Underlying health conditions. It raises the total of COVID-19 related deaths in Collin County to 29 and 7 in Plano.

A Plano case reported on 5/7/20 involving a 53-year-old female from the 75075 zip code has been transferred to Garland. This change is reflected in several categories above including total Plano cases, gender, age and zip code.

There are four cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. Three have recovered and one is in isolation at home. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 282.

11,972 people have been tested for the virus in Collin County. 10,998 tested negative. 939 tested positive. 35 tests are pending.

1,530 people are currently under monitoring (PUM) in Collin County, including 430 in Plano. A PUM is an asymptomatic person with an epidemiologic exposure to the COVID-19 virus. The exposure may be

close contact with a confirmed case or with their infectious secretions or clinical specimens; or designation as a PUM by CDC.
