Collin County Health Care Services (CCHCS) reports 15 new COVID-19 cases in Collin County, including 5 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 978, including 290 in Plano. The County has 310 active cases, including 90 in Plano.

A 71-year-old Plano man with a serious underlying health condition became the 30<sup>th</sup> COVID-19 related death in Collin County and Plano's 8<sup>th</sup>.

There are four cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. All four are now recovered. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 294.

12,687 people have been tested for the virus in Collin County. 11,674 tested negative. 978 tested positive.

1,634 people are currently under monitoring (PUM) in Collin County, including 469 in Plano. A PUM is an asymptomatic person with an epidemiologic exposure to the COVID-19 virus. The exposure may be close contact with a confirmed case or with their infectious secretions or clinical specimens; or designation as a PUM by CDC.
