Collin County Health Care Services (CCHCS) reports 15 new COVID-19 cases in Collin County, including 4 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 1,008, including 297 in Plano. The County has 292 active cases, including 84 in Plano.

One case originally reported in Plano on 5/14 (63-year-old female) is now a Dallas case. The change has been reflected in several categories above including total Plano cases, age, gender and zip code.

A 34 year old Wylie man with a serious underlying health condition died at a Richardson hospital. It raised the Collin County death total to 31.

There are four cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. All four are now recovered. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 301.

13,576 people have been tested for the virus in Collin County. 12,533 tested negative. 1008 tested positive.

1,709 people are currently under monitoring (PUM) in Collin County, including 495 in Plano. A PUM is an asymptomatic person with an epidemiologic exposure to the COVID-19 virus. The exposure may be

close contact with a confirmed case or with their infectious secretions or clinical specimens; or designation as a PUM by CDC.
