Collin County Health Care Services (CCHCS) reports 26 new COVID-19 cases in Collin County, including 15 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 1,073, including 327 in Plano. The County has 314 active cases, including 94 in Plano.

There are four cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. All four are now recovered. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 331.

15,116 people have been tested for the virus in Collin County. 14,008 tested negative. 1,073 tested positive.

1,803 people are currently under monitoring (PUM) in Collin County, including 530 in Plano. A PUM is an asymptomatic person with an epidemiologic exposure to the COVID-19 virus. The exposure may be close contact with a confirmed case or with their infectious secretions or clinical specimens; or designation as a PUM by CDC.
