Collin County Health Care Services (CCHCS) reports 28 new COVID-19 cases in Collin County, including 12 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 1,118, including 342 in Plano. The County has 333 active cases, including 104 in Plano.

Two cases reported as Plano cases on 5/20 are now McKinney cases. They involve a 17-year-old male who was reported in the 75024 zip code and a 32-year-old male who was originally reported in the 75074 zip code. The data above reflects these subtractions in several categories including total Plano cases, age, gender and zip code.

There are four cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. All four are now recovered. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 346.

16,098 people have been tested for the virus in Collin County. 14,945 tested negative. 1,118 tested positive.

1,910 people are currently under monitoring (PUM) in Collin County, including 560 in Plano. A PUM is an asymptomatic person with an epidemiologic exposure to the COVID-19 virus. The exposure may be close contact with a confirmed case or with their infectious secretions or clinical specimens; or designation as a PUM by CDC.
