Collin County Health Care Services (CCHCS) reports 14 new COVID-19 cases in Collin County, including 6 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 1,132, including 348 in Plano. The County has 313 active cases, including 96 in Plano.

CCHCS reported two new deaths, a 98-year-old Plano woman with underlying health conditions and an 82-year-old Richardson woman with underlying health conditions. While the Richardson woman died on 5/3, her death was just reported to the County Friday.

A case changed from Plano to McKinney, originally reported on 5/20/20 is once again a Plano case. It involves A 32-year-old man who lives in the 75075 zip code. The data above reflects that change in several categories including total Plano cases, gender, age and zip code.

There are four cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. All four are now recovered. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 352.

16,295 people have been tested for the virus in Collin County. 15,128 tested negative. 1,132 tested positive.

1,961 people are currently under monitoring (PUM) in Collin County, including 585 in Plano. A PUM is an asymptomatic person with an epidemiologic exposure to the COVID-19 virus. The exposure may be close contact with a confirmed case or with their infectious secretions or clinical specimens; or designation as a PUM by CDC.
