Please note: The Collin County Health Care Services Department was notified Monday that the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) will assume all case management, contact tracing, and reporting duties related to new Collin County COVID-19 cases effective today, May 26, 2020. Collin County Health Care Services had been anticipating this change, but was uncertain when the transition would take place.

DSHS will begin investigating, monitoring, and tracing all new cases starting tomorrow, May 26, 2020. As a result of this change, Collin County will no longer have new case data to provide each day. Instead, Collin County case details will be reported on the [Texas DSHS COVID-19 dashboard](#).

Collin County Health Care Services staff will continue monitoring the 319 current cases and the 2024 current PUMs until they are fully recovered.

Collin County Health Care Services (CCHCS) reports 6 new COVID-19 cases in Collin County, including 1 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 1,157, including 358 in Plano. The County has 315 active cases, including 103 in Plano.

CCHCS reported a Plano case with a Murphy zip code (75094). We are not counting it as a Plano case at this time.

There are four cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. All four are now recovered. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 362.

16,707 people have been tested for the virus in Collin County. 15,515 tested negative. 1,157 tested positive.

2,024 people are currently under monitoring (PUM) in Collin County, including 603 in Plano. A PUM is an asymptomatic person with an epidemiologic exposure to the COVID-19 virus. The exposure may be close contact with a confirmed case or with their infectious secretions or clinical specimens; or designation as a PUM by CDC.
