Collin County Commissioners decided Friday to transfer the responsibility for COVID-19 case investigations, contact tracing and daily reporting to the Texas Department of State Health Services. County officials are sorting out how much local detail they will be able to pull and distribute to the communities.

Collin County Health Care Services reported the death of 63-year-old Plano woman from zip code 75023. She is the County's 34th COVID-19 death and the 10th in Plano.

CCHCS added a case to Plano, an 18-year-old man from zip code 75074 reported on 5/29/20. The addition is reflected in the data box above, including total Plano cases, gender, age and zip code.

Collin County Health Care Services (CCHCS) reports 42 new COVID-19 cases in Collin County, including 11 in Plano. 42 is the highest total of new cases in a single day since the first case was reported. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 1,278, including 393 in Plano. The County has 333 active cases, including 109 in Plano.

There are four cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. All four are now recovered. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 397.

17,907 people have been tested for the virus in Collin County. 16,593 tested negative. 1,278 tested positive.

2,270 people are currently under monitoring (PUM) in Collin County, including 703 in Plano. A PUM is an asymptomatic person with an epidemiologic exposure to the COVID-19 virus. The exposure may be close contact with a confirmed case or with their infectious secretions or clinical specimens; or designation as a PUM by CDC.
