## Coronavirus Update: New Cases in Plano \*\*

\*\* The chart below reflects new COVID-19 cases reported after June 1st when the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) assumed case reporting responsibilities from Collin County. The City of Plano is pleased to announce the return of case reporting. We can now resume our commitment to our community to provide important information about the pandemic, specific to Plano. We extend our gratitude to Collin County and DSHS for collaborating to make this happen. Case data will be automatically downloaded into the County and City of Plano COVID 19 dashboards. It should be complete later this week. Here's the data we have so far.

Collin County Health Care Services (CCHCS) reports 197 new COVID-19 cases in Collin County since June 1, including 51 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 1,515, including 456 in Plano. The County has 435 active cases, including 124 in Plano.

There are four cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. All four are now recovered. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 460.

The County reported two new COVID-19 deaths since the reporting change. A 75-year-old man from Dallas died Friday at a hospital in Plano. The man was a resident of the Collin County portion of the City of Dallas, and officials say he had no known underlying health conditions. An 89-year-old man from Frisco with COVID-19 and underlying health conditions died June 3 at a hospital in Plano.
