The numbers reported on 6/8 were incomplete as data was still coming into the Collin County dashboard. As a result, it's the first time some numbers (age, ZIP codes) have been updated since 6/2/20, when the Texas Department of State Health Services assumed responsibility from Collin County for case reporting. Other numbers are updated from Tuesday, 6/8/20. The totals may change slightly as the information continues to populate the dashboards.

Collin County Health Care Services (CCHCS) reports 78 new COVID-19 cases in Collin County, including 30 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 1,582, including 492 in Plano. The County has 486 active cases, including 155 in Plano.

There are four cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. All four are now recovered. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 496.
