Coronavirus Update: New Cases in Plano*

*The numbers in some of the categories below may not add up to total number of cases as data from DSHS continues to populate the Collin County dashboard. As of June 1, 2020, the Department of State Health Services (DSHS) began all COVID-19 reporting and contact tracing activities for Collin County. The data presented here comes directly from DSHS' Texas Health Trace system.

People Under Monitoring (PUM) and COVID-19 test results are currently unavailable from the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS).

DSHS reports 7 new COVID-19 cases in Collin County, including 3 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 1,609, including 509 in Plano. The County has 301 active cases, including 110 in Plano.

There are four cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. All four are now recovered. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 513.
