DSHS reported 120 new COVID-19 cases in Collin County, including 27 in Plano. The County's total is the highest single day total of new cases since the first case was reported March 9. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 1,787, including 546 in Plano. The County has 454 active cases, including 135 in Plano.

There are four cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. All four are now recovered. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 550.

A 67-year-old man from Celina with COVID-19 and an underlying health condition died Saturday evening at a McKinney hospital. It was the 38th fatality of a Collin County resident with COVID-19 reported to County health authorities.
