DSHS reported 60 new COVID-19 cases in Collin County, including 18 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 2,026, including 621 in Plano. The County has 667 active cases, including 201 in Plano.

There are four cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. All four are now recovered. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 625.
