DSHS reported 42 new cases Saturday and 125 new cases Sunday (total: 167), including 42 in Plano Saturday and 5 on Sunday (Total: 47). The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 2,223, including 678 in Plano. The County has 843 active cases, including 254 in Plano.

There are six cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. Four are recovered. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 684.
