A 51-year-old McKinney man with COVID-19 and an underlying health condition died late Tuesday at a McKinney hospital. This is the 40th death of a County resident with COVID-19 reported to county health authorities.

DSHS reported 37 new cases in Collin County, including 13 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 2,486, including 759 in Plano. The County has 1,062 active cases, including 320 in Plano.

There are eight cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. Five are recovered. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 767.
