Coronavirus Update: New Cases in Plano*

**You'll notice another swing in recovered and active COVID-19 cases. Collin County officials say those numbers are a correction from June 10 and 11, when the State started flagging recovered cases, and the County didn't recognize a new "case closed" field the State had employed; so more patients have recovered than previously reported by the County. When the dashboard updated Friday, the recovered cases went up and active cases fell accordingly to correct the County's oversight -- not the State's. The numbers of positive cases, daily new positives, deaths and hospitalizations were unaffected by this, and are accurate.

A 77-year-old Melissa woman with COVID-19 and an underlying health condition Wednesday at a McKinney hospital. This is the 41st fatality of a county resident with COVID-19 reported to county health authorities.

DSHS reported 139 new cases in Collin County, including 35 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 2,671, including 812 in Plano. The County has 551 active cases, including 147 in Plano.

There are eight cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. Five are recovered. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 820.
