DSHS reported 119 new cases in Collin County, including 29 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 2,882, including 857 in Plano. The County has 693 active cases, including 175 in Plano.

Two new cases were reported in the Denton County portion of Plano, raising the total number of positive cases to 10. Five have recovered. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 867.
