The totals in the data box above may fluctuate based on cases that have been transferred, duplicates or previously unreported from previous days.

DSHS reported 117 new cases in Collin County, including 31 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 3,114, including 929 in Plano. The County has 675 active cases, including 177 in Plano.

An 89-year-old Plano woman with COVID-19 and an underlying health condition died Tuesday evening at a Plano memory care facility. This is the 43rd fatality of a county resident with COVID-19 reported to county health authorities. The woman was a resident of Arbor Hills Memory Care in Plano.

There are 10 positive cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. Five have recovered. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 939.
