From July 2-5, DSHS reported 407 new cases in Collin County, including 81 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 3,521, including 1,007 in Plano. The County has 793 active cases, including 175 in Plano.

A 71-year-old Plano man died Tuesday at a local hospital, diagnosed with an underlying health condition and COVID-19. This is the 46th fatality of a county resident with COVID-19 reported to county health authorities and Plano's 13th.

There were three new positive cases in the Denton County portion of Plano, bringing the total to 13. Five have recovered. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 1,020.
