The totals in the data box above may fluctuate based on cases that have been transferred, duplicates or previously unreported from previous days.

DSHS reported 118 new cases in Collin County, including 16 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 3,825, including 1,060 in Plano. The County has 857 active cases, including 180 in Plano.

3 new deaths were reported in Collin County, including one in Plano. A 61-year-old Plano man with an underlying health condition died at his home on Monday. A 79-year-old Princeton man with an underlying health condition died Thursday at a McKinney hospital. A 77-year-old Fairview man with an underlying health condition died at a Dallas Hospital on June 20.

There are 13 positive cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. Five have recovered. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 1,073.
