The totals in the data box above may fluctuate based on cases that have been transferred, duplicates or previously unreported from previous days.

DSHS reported 123 new cases in Collin County, including 30 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 3,948, including 1,090 in Plano. The County has 794 active cases, including 172 in Plano.

Collin County Health Care Services reported three new COVID-19 deaths. A 69-year-old Dallas man with no known health conditions died June 23 at a Plano hospital. A 73-year-old man from McKinney with underlying health issues died July 3 in a local hospital. An 87-year-old McKinney woman with added health conditions died Tuesday in a local hospital. These latest deaths bring the number of fatalities of county residents with COVID-19 reported to county health authorities to 53.

There are 13 positive cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. Five have recovered. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 1,103.
