The totals in the data box above may fluctuate based on cases that have been transferred, duplicates or previously unreported from previous days.

DSHS reported 160 new cases in Collin County, including 30 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 4,108, including 1,120 in Plano. The County has 765 active cases, including 157 in Plano.

Collin County Health Care Services reported three new deaths related to COVID-19. A 73-year-old man from McKinney with underlying health issues died July 3 at a hospital in Allen. A 68-year-old McKinney man with underlying health conditions died Monday night at a local hospital. An 82-year-old woman with underlying health conditions died early Thursday morning at a Richardson hospital. The three deaths bring the number of fatalities of county residents with COVID-19 to 56.

There was a new positive case in the Denton County portion of Plano, raising the total to 14. Five have recovered. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 1,134.
