DSHS reported 201 new cases in Collin County, including 70 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 4,308, including 1,170 in Plano. The County has 812 active cases, including 198 in Plano.

There are 14 positive cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. Five have recovered. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 1,184.
