The totals in the data box above may fluctuate based on cases that have been transferred, duplicates or previously unreported from previous days.

DSHS reported 115 new cases in Collin County, including 22 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 4,800, including 1,318 in Plano. The County has 917 active cases, including 210 in Plano.

There are 14 positive cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. Five have recovered. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 1,332.

Collin County Health Care Services reported the deaths of three County residents at local health care facilities. All of them had underlying health conditions and COVID-19. An 81-year-old Plano man died today at Arbor Hills Memory Care. A 67-year-old Allen man died Monday evening at Mustang Creek Memory Care. A 61-year-old Plano man died July 6 at a local hospital. The three deaths raises the total of COVID-19 related deaths in the County to 61.
