From July 18-20, DSHS reported 295 new cases in Collin County, including 53 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 5,374, including 1,433 in Plano. The County has 916 active cases, including 202 in Plano.

There are 15 positive cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. 7 have recovered. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 1,448.
