The totals in the data box above may fluctuate based on cases that have been transferred, duplicates or previously unreported from previous days.

DSHS reported 135 new cases in Collin County, including 27 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 5,748, including 1,502 in Plano. The County has 1,019 active cases, including 221 in Plano.

There are 17 positive cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. 7 have recovered. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 1,519.

Collin County reported 6 new COVID-19 related deaths Wednesday. All of them had underlying health conditions. A 79-year-old Richardson woman 19 died early Sunday afternoon at a local hospital. A Frisco man, age 93, died July 6 at a local hospital. A 48-year-old man died Monday night at his home in the Collin County portion of Dallas. An 82-year-old woman died Sunday evening at Mustang Creek Estates, an assisted living facility in Allen. A 49-year-old man died at his Allen home Wednesday morning, and a 91-year-old Allen woman died Monday at Parkland Hospital in Dallas. This brings the total number of COVID-19 related deaths in Collin County to 72.
